




so demanded, at the request of said E. T. Thornton, the said
trustee shall take possession of said property, and after
legal notice thereof sell the same either publicly or privately
and after paying the costs of executing this trust, pay of and
discharge the amount then due E. T. Thornton and the remainder
if any pay to David G. Adkins or his personal representative

This Indenture made the Seventeenth (17) day of
February in the year One thousand Eight hundred and
eighty between John T. Chappell and Hannah Chappell
his wife, of the first part, and Equelin Robinson of the
second part, Witnesseth: that the said party of the first
part for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred
dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of the
second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,
have bargained and sold to the said party of the second
part, a certain parcel of land, lying and being in the
county of Sussex, State of Virginia and bounded as
follows, on the South and East by the Manlye tract,
West by the lands of R. J. Tucker, and North by the
lands of John T. Chappell, containing Twenty five
